#### **Pulicat Lake and Sanctuary**

Pulicat Lake, India's second-largest brackish water lagoon, is a vital ecosystem supporting a diverse range of migratory birds, including the iconic Greater Flamingos, Terns, Egrets, and Seagulls. The lake's tranquil waters and surrounding wetlands provide an unforgettable experience for birdwatchers and nature lovers. Nearby Atakanithippa, along SHAR Road, complements the lake with its vibrant biodiversity, offering exceptional birdwatching opportunities. The serene boating experiences at B.V. Palem further enrich visitors' connection to the natural beauty and cultural heritage of the region.

# **Nelapattu Bird Sanctuary**

Known for its rich biodiversity, Nelapattu serves as a nesting ground for several migratory birds, including Spoonbills, Asian Openbill Storks, and the rare Grey Pelican. This sanctuary is among the largest Pelicanries in Southeast Asia, drawing thousands of birdwatchers and researchers annually. The wetland ecosystem not only supports diverse avian life but also plays a crucial role in regional ecological balance.

# Importance of Bird Migration:

Migratory birds travel thousands of kilometers, indicating the health of ecosystems and maintaining biodiversity. These sanctuaries host over 75 species of aquatic and terrestrial birds annually, providing critical breeding and feeding grounds.

#### Lesser-Known Facts:

Pulicat Lake attracts over 20,000 Greater Flamingos every season.

The vivid pink hue of flamingos is derived from their diet, rich in carotenoids from algae and shrimp.

Nelapattu's wetland ecosystem supports a wide range of flora and fauna unique to this region.
